


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OUR KINDER PROGRAM

In the kinder room, our program is thoughtfully designed to align with the principles of the Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF), focusing on the key areas of Identity, Community, Learning, Communication, and Well-being. While our program maintains a level of structure, it is firmly rooted in the philosophy of play-based learning, recognising the immense value of exploration, creativity, and child-driven activities.

EYLF-Informed Curriculum: Our planning process is deeply reflective of the EYLF, incorporating the five essential elements of identity, community, learning, communication, and well-being. These elements guide our educators in creating a balanced and comprehensive curriculum that addresses the holistic development of each child. Play-Based Learning Our curriculum is centred on play-based activities that promote creativity, curiosity, and exploration. Through various play experiences, children develop fine motor skills, language, and cognitive abilities.

What is Play-Based Learning?

Play-based learning involves activities that are child-directed, allowing them to explore, experiment, and discover at their own pace. It includes both structured and unstructured play, incorporating elements like imaginative play, sensory experiences, and problem-solving.

The Importance of Play-Based Learning:

- Cognitive Development: Play stimulates brain development, enhancing memory, language skills, and cognitive abilities.
- Social and Emotional Growth: Through play, children learn to share, cooperate, and navigate social relationships, fostering emotional intelligence.
- Motor skills: Activities like stacking blocks or crawling contribute to the development of fine and gross motor skills.
- Curiosity and Creativity: Play encourages curiosity, imagination, and creativity, laying the foundation for a love of learning.

At Gum Nut, our program is more than just a curriculum; it's a nurturing space where children can thrive, learn, and develop in an environment that values their individuality and celebrates the diversity of our community. Excursions: The kindergarten program annually organises two excursions: one with an educational focus tailored to the children's interests, and another at the year end to celebrate the completion of the kindergarten year. Individual Observation Planning Records: Every child's unique developmental journey is recorded through Individual Observation Planning Records. These records serve as a valuable tool for our educators to track each child's progress, tailor activities to their specific needs, and ensure a personalised approach to learning.





BUSH KINDER PROGRAM

IIn 2025, Gum Nut Preschool and Childcare will be introducing an enhanced bush kinder program, now available two full days per week (9:30am - 4:30pm).

Our curriculum is centered around the beautiful natural environment of Alphington Park & Wetlands, with plans to gradually expand to include Darebin Parklands and Sparks Reserve. We are committed to creating optimal learning environments for children, emphasising the importance of providing them with ample time and space for exploration. Our approach fosters a consistent and nurturing atmosphere that evolves, promoting curiosity, inspiration, and learning challenges. Recognising that children thrive through outdoor play, we prioritise their happiness and encourage them to take risks. At Gum Nut, we are proud to offer our kindergarten children the unique opportunity to engage in the Bush Kinder Program, set against the stunning backdrop of our local parks and wetlands.

The Bush Kinder program provides children with a multitude of enriching experiences, empowering them to:

Make Meaningful Connections with Nature

- Encourages a deep appreciation for nature and natural materials.
- Fosters a sense of responsibility and stewardship toward the environment.

Navigate Dynamic Environments

- Develops the ability to navigate through changing natural surroundings.
- Promotes ongoing inspiration for learning through consistent yet evolving settings

Enhance Decision-Making and Problem-Solving

- Provides opportunities for independent and collaborative decisionmaking.
- Cultivates problem-solving skills individually and within a group context.

Motor Skills

- Allows for the free and diverse practice of fine and gross motor skills.
- Promotes overall development and encourages a healthy, active lifestyle.

Expand Vocabulary and Expressiveness

- Facilitates the learning of new words and their appropriate expression.
- Develops enhanced communication skills through diverse experiences.
- Cultivate problem-solving techniques
- Encourages experimentation and inquiry.
- Challenges children to push their limits through engaging real-life experiences.

Environmental Awareness and Respect

- Facilitates the understanding and respect of the environment.
- Nurtures a sense of self-awareness and respect for others.

Encourage safe risk-taking

- Provides a secure environment for children to take calculated risks.
- Build social awareness
- Cultivates social skills by promoting teamwork and collaborative discoveries.

Bush Kinder Sessions Guidelines

2025 program sessions will be held on Monday & Thursday

- Children must be at Gum Nut and ready to leave by 9:30am
- Arrival/Departure Procedures If your child's group has departed, late arrivals must remain at the centre.
- To collect your child during Bush Kinder, visit the centre first, sign out your child, collect their belongings, obtain an exit pass from the office, and present it to your child's teacher at the parklands.

Meals

• All meals are provided by Gum Nut during Bush Kinder sessions.

Term 1 Introduction

- Initial focus on road safety.
- Restricted to the top half of the park and marked-out areas.
- Emphasis on walking to/from the park, establishing boundaries, routines, and becoming familiar with the space.

Terms 2, 3 & 4 Progression

- Gradual expansion into parklands as children develop safety awareness.
- Exploration of various areas such as the oval, river trail, old swimming pool, wetland surrounds, creek trail, and bridges.
- Flexibility in offsite learning during Term 4 based on children's fatigue levels.
- Weather and Sun Smart Policy
- Gum Nut's policy applies; ensure children are appropriately dressed for weather conditions.
- Be prepared for extended outdoor activities.

Teacher Accompaniment

• 2-3 teachers will always accompany children during park sessions.

Well-Resourced Program

• Abundant resources provided, including music, literacy, numeracy, and art activities even outdoors.

Restricted Personal Items

• No home toys or valuables from children allowed during Bush kinder program.

Parent Participation

• Parents are always welcome to join the program. Please let the teachers know in advance.

SCHOOL READINESS

During Term 4, our kindergarten program shifts its focus to School Readiness, aiming to prepare your child for the transition to primary school. This inclusive approach accommodates children entering their second year of kindergarten, where we adopt the role of "Kinder Captains."

Key components of our School Readiness program include:

Partnership with Alphington Primary School:

- Establishing a close relationship with Alphington Primary School.
- Organising excursions for children to visit the prep classroom, allowing them to familiarise themselves with the primary school environment.

Interactive Excursions:

- Providing opportunities for children to explore the prep classroom.
- Meeting primary school teachers and students, fostering a sense of familiarity and comfort.
- Encouraging children to ask questions and engage in the school setting.

Learning Recess and Lunchtime Routines:

- Introducing children to recess and lunchtime routines.
- Offering insights into lunchbox etiquette, including opening lunchboxes and not consuming all food at once.

Practical Experience Week:

- Designating a week for children to bring their lunchboxes to Gum Nut.
- Teaching practical skills such as using a bell and seeking permission before using the toilet, preparing them for primary school expectations.

Dramatic Play Area:

- Creating a dramatic play area themed around a primary school.
- Allowing children to engage in role-playing experiences, including trying on school uniforms.
- Generating excitement and anticipation for the upcoming transition to primary school.

Our School Readiness program is designed to prepare children for the next chapter of their educational journey, fostering confidence, familiarity, and excitement about the transition to primary school.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Please remember to sign your child in and out each day (via iPad)

CLOTHING

- Ensure your child is dressed appropriately for exploration; spare clothes for messy play or accidents.
- Pack cool attire for summer and a jacket, beanie, and gumboots for Bush Kinder

FOOTWEAR

• Closed footwear or sandals that cover toes preferred; avoid thongs or crocs for safety during outdoor activities.

MEALS

• Morning tea, lunch, and afternoon tea are provided by Gum Nut. Lunchboxes are discouraged until School Readiness Week unless for dietary reasons.

ALLERGIES:

• Bring a treat box if your child has allergies. All medications must be left at Gum Nut with an action plan from a doctor.

SUNSCREEN:

• Kinder will supply sunscreen unless allergies require you to provide your own. Apply sunscreen before/upon arrival daily.

HATS

• Bulk order of hats for each child; labelled and kept at kinder. Red Kinder hats are not to go home; always keep them in your child's hat pocket.

DRINK BOTTLES:

• Labelled bottles to be in brought daily and taken home to wash; at least 600ml.

TOYS

- Comfort toys are welcomed but encouraged to be put away in bags once settled.
- Home toys are not allowed unless modified and related to program.

LOST PROPERTY:

• Check the lost property tub regularly; unlabelled items will be donated monthly.

• Mid-August, details to follow.

SCHOOL TRANSITION REPORTS

• Parent component to be completed August-September; teachers will complete in September - October.
