Ambulance visit

Recently, one of our amazing parents shared their occupation with the children at Gum Nut.

Melanie, a paramedic visited to show us what it's like to be a first responder in an emergency. It was an exciting day that taught the children a lot about health and safety, and even gave them a chance to explore the Ambulance the children were all thrilled to get a closer look at the vehicle. The paramedics explained the different parts of the ambulance, from the stretchers and medical equipment to the high-tech systems that help them communicate during emergencies.

The paramedics also gave us tips on how to stay healthy and avoid accidents. They shared a story about helping friends when there hurt and even brought in some extra uniforms for the children to dress up! They reminded us to never hesitate to call 000 if there's an emergency.

While learning about the equipment used in emergency care, fostering curiosity and awareness about health-related topics. This experience can also help reduce any fear or anxiety children might have about medical emergencies, as they gain a better understanding of how professionals help in urgent situations.

The children also had the opportunity to ask questions and engage with the ambulance crew which provided a hands-on learning experience that enhances their social, emotional, and cognitive development.
